After-School Programming

- Typically at both Old Town Hall and Brantwood
 - Currently only at Old Town Hall
- Adapting to COVID-19 regulations:
 - Physical distancing regulations
 - More outdoors play
- Flexible programming
 - Online programming developed during the end of school year 2019/2020
 - Strike Day camps offered in 2019/2020



Summer Camps 2020

- ▶ 8 camps at Brantwood, 9 at Old Town Hall
- Quick implementation of new COVID measures:
 - ▶ Reduced maximum number of participants/camp: 24 to 8
 - ▶ Introduction of new safety measures
- High participation!



Community Events in 2020

- Main Event 2020
 - ▶ Re-imagining of our biggest event
 - Activities: Trivia Night, Free Zoom Sessions,
 Competitions, Scavenger Hunt, Roaming Entertainers
 - ► Incorporating local businesses
- Virtual Hallowe'en Party
 - Activities: Free Zombie Make-Up Workshop, Competitions, Spooky Stories, BINGO, Boo Your Neighbour, Yoga





Rental of Facilities and Community Partnerships

- ► Few rentals since March 2019 due to COVID-19

- The Mainstreeter (social issues panels)
- Good Food Box Program
- University of Ottawa's Let's Talk Science (children's workshops)
- Sandy Hill Community Health Centre (newcomer skate, community events)
